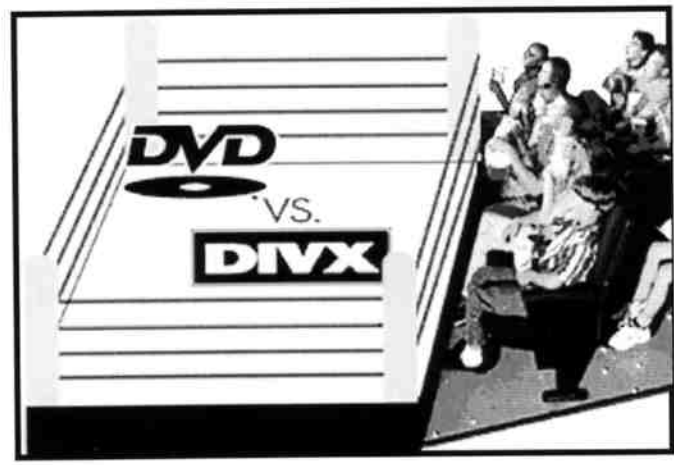

DVD and Divx Setup and Use

If you have a VCR and have bought or rented VHS videos then using a DVD player is going to be a snap.

- Buy or rent a DVD player and hook it up to your TV. Buy or rent a DVD disc. Insert the disc. Hit play and enjoy! That's it!

How about for a Divx player? Well, it's nearly that simple...

- Buy a Divx player and hook it up to your TV. Take the 25-foot telephone cord included, hook it up to your player and then attach it to the nearest phone jack. If your phone is in another room, you'll need to connect it to your Divx player or the player won't be able to work. Also, if you only have one outlet in
